CONSTRUCTION CORNER

Teamwork Makes the Dreamwork

OC San works as a team in everything that we do. Each department contributes to our mission in a unique way. Construction Management is one of the four divisions under the Engineering Department. So, what exactly is Construction Management? In a nutshell it is the overall management during the construction phase of a project. The mission of the Construction Management Division is to ensure timely and quality construction and commissioning execution for every capital improvement project.

So who oversees this division? Longtime OC San employee Dean Fisher is the division manager, and he just celebrated 30 years of service. The Construction Management team works with the Operation and Maintenance Department, the contractor, and the design engineer during the construction of a project.

The team is largely dependent on the type of project being built, but generally has the following components: a resident engineer who leads the way; a project manager, who is responsible for schedule and budget; a construction inspector, who coordinates and verifies everything in the field; a technical support team that may include schedulers, estimators, engineering assistants, commissioning agents, among others to ensure all the details are examined and checked thoroughly; the design engineer who is responsible for the design of the project; the contracts administrator who is part of purchasing and plays an integral part of the team to ensure Public Contract Law is being met and assists Construction Management to find solutions to procurement issues and contractual disputes; and for those public facing projects a community liaison from the outreach team.

Construction Management has a few major projects in the works. At Plant No. 1, current projects include the Headworks Rehabilitation and the new Headquarters Building.

Over at Plant No. 2 the new Outfall Low Flow/Plant Water Pump Station project, the Headworks Modification for the Groundwater Replenishment System, and most recently the Primary Clarifier Replacement project are just a few of the larger ongoing projects.

In Collections, Construction Management is wrapping up the Newhope-Placentia Trunk Sewer project on State College Boulevard in Anaheim and continuing the Westminster Force Main project in Westminster and Seal Beach. New pipeline rehabilitation projects will also be starting soon along Los Alamitos Boulevard and Katella Avenue in Seal Beach and Los Alamitos area, and Orange Avenue and Western Avenue in Cypress, Buena Park, and Anaheim area.

You can imagine the number of projects Dean has seen over the years, so we asked if there was any one project that was particularly memorable.

"You tend to remember the things that didn't go right and the one that just sticks in my head was trying to replace the Newport Beach Force Mains under the Newport Boulevard Bridge.

Nothing came easy with this project for a lot of reasons. We hit so many obstacles, the entire team was dumbfounded. I remember a 7 a.m. Sunday morning conference call involving 20 people trying to find a solution. At one moment someone said, 'So we tried everything, nothing has worked, and we do not have a solution, does that sum it up?' Later that day we reconvened at the site, figured out some new ideas and put them to work and eventually found a solution. In construction, sometimes you just need to persevere when the odds are against you."

This year, we had 32 projects totaling \$24 million in construction cost that were advertised or projected to be advertised, next year we'll have another 27. Needless to say, Construction Management will continue to be busy over the next few years.

General Manager's FY 2020-2021 Year-End Report

Every year the General Manager, meets with the Executive Management Team to create goals that involve all aspects of OC San that help us reach the next level of success.

The General Manager's FY 2020-2021 Work Plan was adopted by the Board of Directors in August 2020. The work plan contained 17 individual goals organized under four focus areas including:

- Business Principles
- Environmental Stewardship
- Wastewater Management
- Workplace Environment

In January, a mid-year update was provided and this month the year-end report is being presented to the Board of Directors. What are the results? As of the middle of June, nearly all goals have been met or are on schedule to be completed by June 30. Three of the goals will carry over to the next fiscal year.

The goals presented to the Board of Directors are accomplished thanks to the hard work of every single employee. It is truly a team effort to make the plan and OC San a success. Another successful year for OC San!

The PAO is part of the General Manager's Office with the team located in the Administration Building at Plant No. 1. They are responsible for creating, organizing, and disseminating all internal and external communication. The primary objective of the team is to deliver messages that are accurate, transparent, and designed to foster public trust and confidence. The PAO staff provides many services including planning and implementing media relations; website and intranet site content; construction outreach; government relations; internal communications, education, and outreach; and graphic development.

- Communications/Media Relations: traditional media relations such as working with the local newspapers, news releases and media alerts. Additionally, the staff manages all of the social media platforms including Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and LinkedIn. - Community Liaisons: the PAO team (with support from Engineering) serves as the community's contact during construction and maintenance activities. The liaison informs the community of our activities through notifications, community meetings, a 24-hour hotline. The liaison helps to facilitate inquiries and concerns between OC San staff and the community.

They aren't the only ones on the move. The PCI group has moved to Mount Langley to make room for a new standby generator building


